WHAT IS A CLIMBING STEWARD?

Climbing Stewards work as interns/volunteers helping Yosemite National Park (NPS) with stewardship focused work. As we try to reflect the changing makeup of our climbing community, we encourage climbers from all backgrounds to apply to these positions.



Vacancies:

- 1 or 2 six-month seasonal internships focused on climbing trails work
- 1 or 2 internships specific to college undergraduate or graduate students. We will ask you to come up with a project to undertake and complete during your time here. It can be relevant to your studies or independent.
- 2-4 short term internships (2-4 months from April to Nov)

HOW TO APPLY

1. Letter of Intent/Cover Letter

- Why are you interested?
- Why do you think you would be a good fit?
- Have you worked, volunteered, or had personal experience involving in justice, equity, diversity, and inclusion? Tell us about your experience.
- What do you hope to get out of the position?
